PAC Meeting - Principal's Report - October 29, 2020 Amber Flanagan

- 1. Halloween Halloween is a bit different this year, but with the school pumpkin patch and the various classroom activities, we are finding ways to bring Halloween fun to our school! The pumpkin patch looked amazing!! The sign, hay bales and decorations made for a fabulous backdrop.
 - a. **Glow** the event (not affiliated with the school) that is usually in the school parking lot is in the church parking lot this year, with socially distanced distribution and health and safety measures in place
- 2. Parent Conferences we had virtual or telephone conferences with parents and the turnout was higher than usual. It seems the alternate methods made it more accessible for families and may be something we offer in the future as an alternative for parents. Families are feeling more disconnected this year too it seems, so it was nice to find ways to connect
- 3. Earth Rangers we have a virtual presentation from Earth Rangers on November 17. It is sponsored by HSBC and our school qualified for a presentation after being nominated by some parents who work there.
 - a. Through the power of live animal demonstrations and positive, science-based information, our program educates students about the threats facing animals and the environment, highlights real conservation initiatives across Canada, and motivates them to want to get involved.
- 4. COVID 19 Health and Safety we are continuing to follow all of the procedures in place in the school (e.g. cohorts, physical distancing inside the school between cohorts, staff wearing masks in all common areas, ordered plexi glass for LST, Counselling, SLP and Library, regular cleaning and staying home if unwell). We appreciate the support of parents and families who are keeping their children home if they have any symptoms of illness.

a. District/Fraser Health Process/Procedure:

i. If a student or staff member tests positive, either we find out first and we complete a form and send it to the district, who connects with Fraser Health OR Fraser Health contacts the district - from there Fraser Health does contact tracing and determines who would be considered a close contact. Privacy is number one, so even if we find out we are not able to share that information with anyone other than district Health and Safety and Fraser Health.



ii. It is considered an exposure in a school if the positive person was in the school within 48 hours before symptoms started. So, if a person received a positive result but had not been at school for 4 days before the symptoms began, we would not be notified or get a letter to send home. If the person was at school within the 'infectious' period, we would get a letter to send home and Fraser Health will determine who the close contacts might be and what the next steps are.

b. Daytime Cleaning Changes

i. If a student or staff member shows symptoms of COVID at school (fever, coughing, vomiting, diarrhea) they are isolated, put on a mask, sent home ASAP, then the spaces are cleaned by the custodian - currently that was done with a cloth and spray - starting next week that will be done with the fogging machine. This means classes would leave the room for 10 minutes (go outside, in the hallway or gym if free) so the fogging can be done.
